Hazel Hargraves, a History Society member, who had travelled from Essex for the evening, was related to the landlord of the Castle Hotel and the Davis family and she spoke of her research into her family history, which also included the Birch family who lived in Creek Cottage opposite Hampton Court Station until a few years ago.

The People and Buildings Group is studying the census, and an appeal was made for help in transcribing the Molesey census to make it easy for everyone to use. This Group has subdivided into various topics, one studying local artists, such as Terence Cuneo, who died recently and another which is investigating the history of Matham Manor and the people who lived there.

Schools also come under this Group, and we heard a talk about the interviews that have been conducted with local people who went to Hampton Court school. We also heard memories of World War II, when lessons were interrupted by time spent in the air raid shelters and a terrifying account of the playground of the Girls' and Boys' Central School, Ray Road, being strafed with enemy bullets, when it was a miracle that none of the children was hit. These interviews will be archived for future use.
